

Wait List

If a program is at maximum enrollment, you can be added to a wait list. If/when a spot opens, the Recreation Department will contact you based on order of enrollment.

Code of Conduct

Participants are expected to exhibit appropriate behavior at all times while participating, spectating, or attending any program or event sponsored by Cherry Hill Township. Registration Waiver

A registration waiver is required when signing up for a program through Cherry Hill Township. Class is to be attended by the registrant only. Parents and siblings are not permitted to stay in class unless indicated in the course description.

Confirmations

You will receive an emailed receipt for your purchase of each class. You may or may not receive correspondence from your instructor or the Cherry Hill Recreation Department prior to your first class.

Cancellations/Refunds

- Cancellations or transfers must be made 7 days before the class begins.
- The Recreation Department will notify you by phone/email if there are class cancellations and/or schedule modifications. For inclement weather cancellations, we will do our best to notify registrants via phone/ email. You may also go online to www.CHNJ.gov/Recreation or Facebook (@Cherry Hill Recreation).
- Refunds will not be given after the first day of class except in the case of injury or illness. Written documentation from a physician is required.
- Refunds are subject to \$15 processing fee.
- Credits will not be issued for refunds.
- Classes are subject to enrollment.
- Courses canceled due to inclement weather or instructor absence will be made up at the end of the session.
- No refunds for classes under \$25 or tickets.

Planting a Pollinator Garden

Help the bees, butterflies and other pollinators by planting your own pollinator garden! No matter how large or small, it will provide a habitat for pollinators that will add beauty to your yard and sustain pollinators crucial to the environment. Follow the steps below, and your yard may even qualify for the National Wildlife Federation's Certified Wildlife Backyard (for details, visit: www.nwf.org/Home/Garden-for-Wildlife).

- 1. Prepare your site by removing grass and other plants, including the roots. Consider a soil test and observe the soil, drainage, and amount of light. Do not use landscape fabric or black mulch.
- 2. Choose native plants which are already adapted to the local climate. For a list of recommended plants and other pollinator garden resources, visit: www.chnj.gov/pollinatorgardens. Avoid hybrids. Buy seed/plants that will thrive in your yard's condition (i.e. shade, full sun, etc).
- 3. Specifically choose plants that are pollen and nectar rich in a range of shapes, sizes, and colors. This helps attract pollinators. Choose plants that will provide blossoms from spring to fall.
- 4. Provide a water source for birds that is no deeper than two inches. A simple roasting pan will do the trick. Be sure to change the water every day. Provide an area for perching and resting, such as an old log or branches.
- 5. Avoid pesticides, if possible. Many will kill the pollinators you are trying to attract. If necessary, use organic or natural pesticides, preferably before the plants flower. Some herbs can be planted as companion plants to deter pests.
- 6. Save clean-up of the perennial plants until the spring. These plants provide protection and a nesting site to the pollinators, especially native bees over the winter. Also, seed heads and berries can provide winter food for non-migratory birds like cardinals, white-throated sparrows, and Northern Juncos.




