Trash & Recycling Guidelines

General Guidelines

Updated May 2022

All trash and recyclable materials must be placed curbside no earlier than 5:30pm on the evening prior to collection day and all emptied containers must be removed no later than 5:30pm once collection is made. On your trash day, collection begins at 7am. Please ensure that containers are placed curbside in a timely manner. *Late outs will not be collected.*

Automated Residential Solid Waste Collection

Residential solid waste needs to be placed into the **green 95 or 64-gallon containers**, which were distributed by the township. **Solid waste placed loosely, into bags or containers other than those provided by the Township will not be collected.** Residents needing additional containers should contact the Department of Public Works at (856) 424-4422 for more information.

Wood/Lumber and Construction Materials must be tied, bundled, weigh less than 50 pounds and may not exceed 4 feet in length. *Nails, spikes and screws must be removed/bent over to prevent injury.* Waste resulting from homes under renovation is the responsibility of the individual or contractor performing the work to have removed. **Concrete and similar material** may be disposed of in the **Green** Cherry Hill issued tote, once broken into small palm sized pieces; (*totes are able to hold about 150lbs*). **Private contractors** shall remove the debris materials from the site and shall dispose of the debris properly at their own cost. This debris is not to be placed for normal residential collection. (Solid Waste/Recycling Ord. #19-2.13)

Furniture/Bulk items such as mattresses, couches, dressers, cabinets, toilets, wooden bed frames, etc. are collected on your normally scheduled trash day and must be placed out the night before or by 7am collection morning. **Mirrors, windows and similar glass pieces** under 4 feet by 4 feet must be taped and secured for trash day. Larger mirrors, windows and similar glass pieces must be broken down, bagged and put into your **green** issued trash tote.

Furniture/Bulk pickups do not have to be scheduled in advance. Please contact the DPW office at (856) 424-4422 the morning after your collection day to notify us if your pickup was missed. Furniture, if in good condition, may be donated to Habitat for Humanity Restore (856) 439-6717, 530 NJ-38, Maple Shade Township, NJ 08052.

Carpet/Rugs & Padding must be cut into 4-foot lengths, rolled and tied into bundles weighing no more than 50 pounds. *Bags will not be collected outside the issued trash tote(s).*

Railroad Ties and thicker lumber must be cut no longer than 2 feet in length and neatly stacked. *Nails, spikes and screws must be removed/bent over to prevent injury.*

Household Hazardous Waste Paints, varnishes, gasoline, aerosols, anti-freeze and combustibles **cannot be placed curbside.** Events are planned by Camden County Environmental Department, call (856) 858-5241 for scheduled drop-off days March through October.

Appliances and Metal Items are collected each Wednesday, **by appointment only.** This includes refrigerators, grills, stoves, washers, dryers, water tanks and other metal items. Remember to remove doors from refrigerators, stoves, freezers, and dishwashers. Item must be placed curbside by 7am Wednesday morning to ensure its collection. Call the Department of Public Works at (856) 424-4422 by Tuesday 3pm to schedule a metals pickup.

Automated Single-Stream Recycling Collection

All recyclable material is to be placed into the Township issued **blue 95 or 64-gallon containers** for collection.

Cardboard should be cut into smaller, manageable pieces with a box cutter and placed into the **blue** Cherry Hill issued recycling container or brought to the Department of Public Works located at 1 Perina Blvd. Monday through Friday from 7:30am to 3:00pm. **Items placed outside of the blue recycling container will not be collected. Trash cannot be placed into boxes, it will not be collected. Styrofoam must be removed.**

Plastic bags should NEVER be placed in your recycling bins. Plastic bags are easily tangled in the processing equipment and can shut down the recycling facility. Plastic bags can be recycled at the main entrance of many big box stores, local grocery stores, or can be brought to the Department of Public Works, the Municipal Building, and the Cherry Hill Public Library.

Yard Waste Collection

Grass clippings, small tree and shrub trimmings, leaves and similar debris are collected one time per week on your normal solid waste and recycling collection day. The Township recommends that these items be placed into open lid containers that are between 25 and 35 gallons (please keep in mind that residents are permitted to use up to 50 gallon container(s) but the contents cannot exceed the 50 pound weight limit that is clearly marked "Yard Waste." Yard waste labels are available free of charge at the DPW facility. **Dirt and mulch are not yard waste, containers and paper bags contaminated with dirt/mulch will not be removed curbside.** Small amounts of dirt and mulch can be placed into your green trash tote for trash day.

Yard waste containers should not have lids placed on them while they are out at the curb for weekly collection. In addition, containers with attached or hinged lids are not permitted to be used as yard waste containers.

Yard waste is also permitted to be placed out for collection in biodegradable, paper bags. The Township provides brown, biodegradable bags as a courtesy to our residents; bags are available at the DPW facility. Residents must provide proof of residency (ID, driver's license) to receive bags. ***Yard waste is not permitted to be placed out in plastic bags; Yard waste placed out in plastic bags will not be collected.***

Branches must be cut into lengths that do not exceed 4 feet and securely bundled in a manner that does not exceed 50 pounds. Trunks/Logs must be cut to lengths no larger than 2 feet, no thicker than 6 inches in diameter, no heavier than 50 pounds then neatly stacked curbside for removal.

Christmas trees are to be put curbside and must be removed of all decorations/stands with branches tied back using string or twine. Trees cannot be disposed in plastic bags. Natural trees may also be dropped off at Public Works in the weeks following the Christmas Holiday, please contact the DPW Office (856) 424-4422 for more information. *Flocked trees are not yard waste and should be treated as bulk (collected curbside loosely, not bagged or boxed, with the decorations/stands removed or placed into your green trash tote as long as the lid can close.)*

Do NOT mix recyclables with trash! Do NOT place hazardous waste out for collection!

Do NOT place in Blue Recycle Tote

- **Plastic bags**, Styrofoam, coat hangers, pots, pans, buckets, or paint cans
- Ceramics, light bulbs, dishes, mirrors or window glass
- Antifreeze bottles, used oil containers or hazardous materials
- Hardcover books (books can be donated to the Cherry Hill Library)

Electronic Waste (E-Waste)

- State law no longer permits residents to place their TVs, computers and unwanted electronics out for curbside trash collection. However, Cherry Hill provides a designated drop-off site for residents.
- TVs, small appliances, computers, printers, and other electronics are to be dropped off at the Department of Public Works facility located at **1 Perina Blvd Cherry Hill NJ 08003**. Please drop off your E-Waste items Monday through Friday from 7:30am to 4:30pm and Saturday from 7am to 11am.

DO NOT add these items to the trash/recycle stream.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q. How do I know which plastics are recyclable?

A. Plastic containers #1 & #2 are recyclable; the numbers can be found at the bottom of the container. All other plastics would go into the green Cherry Hill issued trash can. Plastic bags should NEVER be placed in your recycling bins.

Q. When do I put out sofas, chairs, mattresses, toilets, dressers etc.?

A. Place these items curbside on your regular trash day, they are considered "BULK. A separate truck should arrive to collect by the end of the day (about 6pm). If missed, please call the Department of Public Works at (856) 424-4422 the morning following your collection.

Q. What do I do with bicycles, hot water heaters, household appliances and large pieces of metal?

A. Call the Department of Public Works by Tuesday 3pm at (856) 424-4422 to schedule a White Goods Wednesday pickup.

Q. The Recycling Truck just took my Recycling but left my Yard Waste, why?

A. Yard Waste is picked up by a separate truck as a recyclable item later in the same day.

Q. Can residents recycle shredded paper?

A. No. Once paper is shredded, it may go into your green Cherry Hill issued tote as trash.

Q. How can I dispose of tires, used motor oil and batteries?

A. Bring used oil, car tires (off the rim) and **RECHARGABLE** batteries to the Department of Public Works building, 1 Perina Blvd. or save these items for Camden County Hazardous Waste collection day.

Q. Can residents get additional Recycling and/or Trash totes (95/64 gallon blue/green totes)?

A. Yes! Residents are able to purchase additional totes for a onetime payment, check or money order only, of \$50.00 made out to Cherry Hill Township. Payment may be mailed to 820 Mercer Street Cherry Hill NJ 08002 with attention to the Department of Public Works on the envelope. Please include your address, best contact phone number, which tote you need (Green Trash and/or Blue Recycle tote) and your normally scheduled collection date.

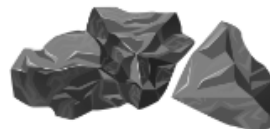

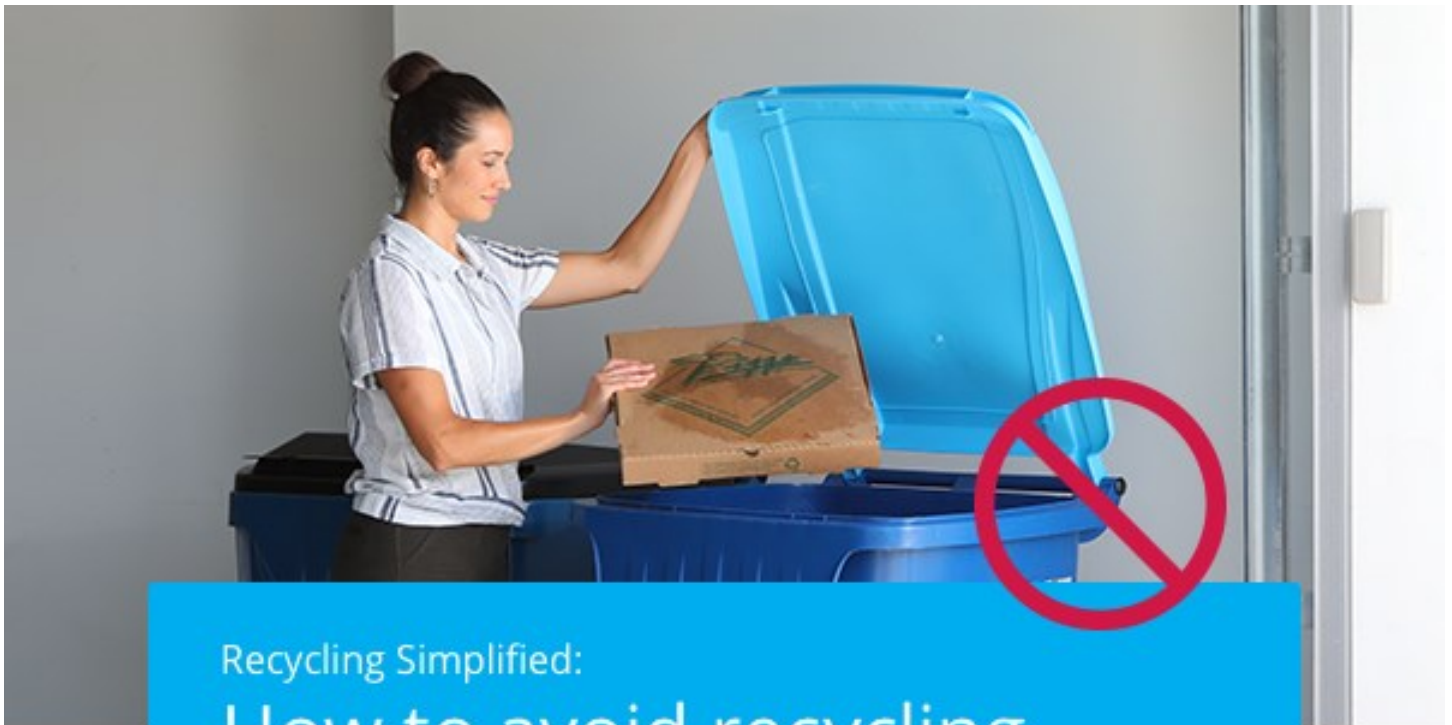

Recycling's Dirty Dozen

1. NO Plastic Bags

Plastic bags are the WORST contaminant in the recycling bin. When placed in a curbside bin, they get wet and dirty and cannot be recycled. Plastic bags are #2 or #4 can be recycled at big box stores, Cherry Hill Department of Public Works Complex or the Municipal Building if they are clean, dry and empty.

2. NO Materials in Plastic Bags

Workers have to slow the conveyor belts to rip open bags that contain recyclables and then add the bag to the heap of bags bounds for the landfill. These inefficiencies waste time and money.

3. Shredded Paper

Shredded paper is too small to sort. These pieces fall through the cracks of the sorting machines, stick to the belts and end up all over the floor. Please avoid shredding when possible because it destroys the potential for recycling. Compost shredded materials can be place in your compost bin or brought to DPW.

4. NO Scrap Metal

Scrap metal items of any size should not go into your curbside bin. These items cause excessive damage to the recycling equipment.

5. NO Hazardous Waste

Hazardous waste such as paint, automotive fluids, car batteries, and pesticides can be taken during Hazardous Waste collection events throughout the year or brought to the DPW complex.

6. NO Diapers or Bio-Hazardous Waste

Syringes and needles, diapers, and other sanitary products are not recyclables.

7. NO Non-Recyclable Plastics

There are many plastics that are still not recyclable. Plastic lids, foam, and any other plastics not listed in our recycling guidelines are not recyclable because stable markets do not exist for these materials.

8. NO Flattened Containers

The single-stream sorting equipment separates "flats" (paper) from "rounds" (containers). When containers are flattened, the equipment mistakenly sends them to the paper side of the facility, significantly contaminating the paper we're sending to market.

9. NO Caps/Lids

Metal lids can be removed and recycled loose in the bin. Plastic lids and caps from glass bottles and jars should be thrown away.

10. NO Liquids

When we use compact bottles for shipping, liquids drip, splatter, and explode all over the floor - creating a sticky, smelly mess on the sorting floor. Please completely empty and quickly rinse out all containers before recycling.

11. NO Ceramics or Non-Recyclable Glass

Ceramics, china, dishes, mirrors, light bulbs, porcelain, and window glass should not go into the bin. Their different melting points and chemical compositions will ruin new glass bottles.

12. NO Frozen Food Containers

Paperboard boxes that were designed for freezer foods, such as frozen pizza, and entrees, have plastic polymer sprayed on them to protect against freezer burn. That same coating prevents the box from breaking up in the recycling process. These materials are not recyclable or compostable.



Instructions for the disposal of water based latex paint

Latex paint is non-hazardous and should not be brought to the Camden County Household Special Waste Collections. It can be disposed of in the regular trash, provided it is first dried out.

Following these simple steps, you can dispose of latex paint in the trash, year round.

- Check the label for an indication that the paint is latex or cleans up with “soap and water”.
- Gather the following materials; cardboard box, strong plastic trash bag, kitty litter or sand.
- Place a cardboard box on the ground. Place a strong plastic bag inside the box, fitting the open ends of the bag over the sides of the box. Place a small amount of sand or kitty litter into the plastic bag.
- Open the paint can and pour the paint into the plastic bag with the kitty litter/sand, adding more kitty litter/sand, if needed. Mix together.
- Leave plastic bag open and allow the air in. Wait for the kitty litter/sand to absorb the paint. This may take from a few hours to a few days depending on weather conditions and the amount of paint.
- When the paint is fully dry, pull the ends of the plastic trash bag together and secure tightly. Discard the plastic bag into the regular trash.
- Allow the residue inside the empty paint can to harden and dispose of the can in the regular trash with the lid off.

Snow Removal

Guidelines

Our Public Works Department works hard to make driving safer and easier in snowy weather. Depending on the duration and amount of snowfall, township trucks may plow your street several times. As snow rolls off our plows, it sometimes accumulates in driveway aprons. Please understand that this is unavoidable and it is the homeowner's responsibility to clear it. Here are some helpful hints to make snow removal less frustrating:

Please remove the following items from the street in front of your home:

1. Trash/recyclable containers. Place on the grassy planter strip between curb and sidewalk.
 2. Portable basketball backboard systems.
- Do not park cars on the street from 1 hour after the snow has continuously fallen until 12 hours after the snow has stopped. This speeds the removal process and prevents cars from being plowed in.
 - If possible, wait until the township trucks have made at least 3 passes on your street before cleaning your driveway.
 - Shovel and/or blow snow onto the curb, not into the street.
 - Shovel snow to the right side of your driveway (facing the street) to minimize the amount of snow entering your driveway.
 - To insure safety of pedestrians, residents must remove snow within 48 hours of daylight following a snowfall.
 - Please remember that children are walking to schools and bus stops all over town.

In the event of deep snow, please shovel around your mailbox and fire hydrants near your house for your safety and your neighbors' safety.

Leaf Collection

Program Benefits

You can bag your leaves in open biodegradable bags or place in open trash cans at the curbside on your regular trash and recycling day. Although many residents have taken advantage of this opportunity, many more do not. We hope that you will help save money and keep our streets safe.

The 2023 regularly-scheduled township leaf collection will begin the week of October 23rd. Every neighborhood will have signs posted one week prior to their scheduled leaf collection. There will also be secondary pickups scheduled (weather permitting) for each neighborhood.

Residents must comply with the following guidelines to ensure pickup of their leaves:

- Cars must be removed from the street between the hours of 7:00 am and 5:30 pm
- Do not rake your leaves until signs have been posted in your neighborhood
- Plastic bags are not permitted
- Landscape / lawn services must remove leaves from site and may use the Kresson Road Ecology Site at no cost; permits may be picked up at the Cherry Hill Department of Public Works
- Leaves must be raked to the park strip area near the roadway. Do not place leaves in the street
- Department of Environmental Protection regulations restrict leaves from being placed within 10 feet of any storm drains.
- Leaf piles with branches or other debris mixed in will not be collected
- Check the township website homepage "News" for weekly leaf collection updates
- It is sometimes difficult to collect the leaves at the right time and get everything completed before the snow season, as the same equipment is also used for snow removal, so we ask for your understanding and help. Please be aware that rain can also slow down the process.

Haul Your Own

Residents who wish to dispose of leaves are permitted to do so at the Kresson Road Ecology Site at no cost. Please call the Department of Public Works for Ecology Site hours and to receive permission to use the site.

Leaf Compost

The Township of Cherry Hill is pleased to provide you with this free leaf compost. This leaf compost is the final result of the Township's previous leaf collection efforts. Leaves are collected and transported to our Ecology Center located off Kresson Road. Following the collection season (October through December each year), the Department of Public Works develops windrows of leaves and monitors temperature and oxygen content of these windrows allowing for the decomposition to this final product. Our Ecology Center is an approved New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection, Class C Recycling Facility (NJ EMS – PI #133936) following strict guidelines as to the maintenance of the site as well as the development of this end product. Please note that as this compost is not screened prior to its offering, small amounts of debris may be present. This debris is simply standard solid waste and can be disposed of with your municipal trash.

The Township appreciates your interest in this leaf compost, as your use completes the loop of sustainability in regard to our leaf collection process.

Property Maintenance Regulations

The Property Maintenance Code is an essential part of maintaining the appearance and integrity of Cherry Hill Township. This code holds property owners responsible for the upkeep of their properties. Cherry Hill takes an aggressive approach toward addressing and correcting property maintenance violations.

Guidelines: In order to help keep Cherry Hill looking its best, please follow these property maintenance guidelines on your property:

- All trash and recycling should be permanently stored in containers in the rear or side yards.
- Trash and recycling waste should not be placed at the curb prior to 5:30 p.m. the night before your scheduled collection day and no later than 7:00 a.m. on collection day. Trash improperly placed at the curb for collection is handled by Cherry Hill Public Works Department. To report improperly placed trash, please contact the Department of Public Works at (856)-424-4422.
- Tied tree limbs, yard waste in open containers, and leaves bagged in biodegradable leaf bags can be left at the curb for recycling. Branches should be cut to 4 foot lengths and tied in bundles of not more than 50 pounds. Yard waste in plastic bags will not be collected. Complaints related to yard waste should be directed to Cherry Hill Public Works Department. They can be reached at (856)-424-4422.
- Any sign posted on a telephone pole or tree in Cherry Hill is illegal. Citizens may remove signs themselves or report the sign to our Property Maintenance Hotline at (856) 436-8836.
- Grass or weeds cannot be higher than 10 inches, so remember to mow your yard before it reaches this height. If high grass is reported at your property you will receive a letter indicating that you have 10 days to rectify the condition. If the condition is not rectified you may be summonsed to court to pay a fine and the Township will mow your lawn and place a lien on the property until the cost of the mowing is paid. To report high grass, please call our Property Maintenance Hotline at (856) 436-8836. If you do call to report an incidence of high grass please have the address of the property where the problem is occurring.
- Inoperable vehicles (those without current registration, inspection stickers, and no insurance) cannot be stored in driveways, on the street, or anywhere on your property. Please contact Property Maintenance for inoperable vehicles parked on private property at the phone number below. If the vehicle is parked on a public street it is considered a motor vehicle violation and is handled by the Cherry Hill Police Department. The Police Department can be reached at (856) 665-1200.
- Pet owners must curb their dogs and immediately remove and dispose of all waste.

Owners whose property violates any provision of the code are notified to correct the violation and comply with the regulations. The Township works rigorously to keep Cherry Hill looking its best. Contact us anytime by calling (856) 436-8836.
