CAMDEN COUNTY

HOME IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

Income eligible homeowners may be eligible for a 0% interest, deferred payment loan program which provides qualified applicants with funding for needed home repairs. Eligible work items include things such as: exterior, interior, roof, siding, windows, heating systems and electrical systems.

The program may not be used for room additions or upgrades.

(Roof, HVAC & Handicap Ramps are forgivable after 10 years)

How does the program work?

If an applicant is deemed eligible, their project is assigned to an approved contractor. Staff monitors all work to ensure it is done correctly and within the guidelines of the program.

What does it cost?

Projects will result in a 0% interest loan in the form of a lien placed on the property. With this lien, no payments are required until the time of sale or a change in ownership.

Who is eligible for the program?

Homeowners must reside within one of the eligible municipalities and the household income must be lower than the income limits below.

The Cherry Hill Police Department and the Department of Public Works have received numerous complaints from residents regarding tree service companies soliciting work without a permit. These companies often perform work and inform the resident that they will return to pick up the branches or that the Cherry Hill Public Works Department will remove the branches. On one occasion, a male falsely represented himself as a public works employee and guaranteed the branches would be removed by the Township.

As per the Solid Waste & Recycling Ordinance, any yard waste generated by a commercial landscaper must be removed by them and will not be collected by the Township. Municipal employees will never knock on doors to solicit any type of work or ask for payment. We ask that residents contact the Cherry Hill Police Department non-emergency line (856-665-1200) to report any companies soliciting without a permit.

Attracting Wildlife to Your Spring Garden

The Cherry Hill Environmental Board (CHEB) strives to serve as an environmental resource to our township, promoting activities that enhance our local ecology.

According to NJ Audubon Society, most space in NJ is already developed or protected. To counteract the limited wildlife habitat area in New Jersey, CHEB suggests adding habitat areas when you plan your spring garden.

Here are a few simple, practical, and actionable ways you can encourage wildlife to your property this spring:

Create a wildlife habitat. Adding native trees and plants to your yard provides habitat resources for bees, butterflies and birds. Consider having your yard certified as a wildlife habitat. Visit our website to learn more: www.chnj.gov/CHEB.

Mow less often. Allow rabbits to be your 'first lawnmower'. Alternatively, mow in February and March, and then reduce frequency as species begin to emerge in April.

Leave a section wild. Whether it be allowing native grasses to take over, or leaving a log, leaf or brush pile, you can attract birds, woodland creatures, amphibians, butterflies, bees, lightning bugs and more by providing cover and food. For example, bees love the white clover that emerges in our lawns around May. Fun fact, no-mow grass has better heat tolerance!

Create a balcony garden. If you're short on space, use a variety of flowerpots containing herbs, as well as flowers that produce nectar and seeds, to attract wildlife. Try lavender, verbena, or sunflowers.

Start small by choosing one item from the list above, and begin your planning now for the best chance of success. Let's make our township a green, flourishing habitat for all.

Cherry Hill Police Department Implements L.E.A.D. Program for 6th Grade Students

The L.E.A.D. program is a collaboration between LEAD-certified law enforcement officers, educators, students, parents, and the community to prevent or reduce drug abuse and violence among youth. Piloted in 2023 at Rosa International Middle School for 6th graders by Officers Anthony Amato and Gerald Gares, the program expanded in the 2023-2024 school year, to include Beck and Carusi Middle Schools, where it continues today. The Cherry Hill Police Department has 15 certified LEAD instructors who teach ten lessons over the course of ten weeks at each school.

The curriculum effectively reduces adolescent alcohol, marijuana, and tobacco use by preparing



students to act decisively in refusing offers to use drugs, recognize the risks and avoid drug-related situations. It also focuses on building strong decision-making, communication, planning and assertive refusal skills. At the core of the program is empowering youth to value their own perceptions and

feelings and make choices that support drug-free values.

This program is just one of the many ways in which the Cherry Hill Police Department connects with our community. Our commitment in educating young children also plays an integral role in making Cherry Hill a safe community.


